THE CHAPLAIN'S WORD

America's Parade!

A few weeks ago we celebrated Veteran's Day and New York City was bustling with military men and women along with their families to participate in "America's Parade." People from all over came to see and pay homage to all the military personnel who marched up 5th Avenue. Onlookers lined the parade route as thousands of military, active, and inactive, walked or rode up Manhattan's streets to the cheering voices of a grateful citizenry. As I watched the parade on TV and from my easy chair, I could see the respect and honor that all the military personnel felt as they either marched or were sitting as onlookers. I had reports to create for our Archdiocese dealing with the Hospital Ministry and I knew it would take me most of the day to finish them. So this year, I am sorry to say, I did not attend the parade.

However, as I watch and saw the love for this country these military members have for it, it really moved me. I have been to many Reunions and

Parades with my brothers in arms for years, and have experienced first-hand the ugliness of war. No one can understand the deep emotion that one feels for this nation except for those who served our country in the military and that includes myself. To give your life for something greater than yourself is an awesome feeling, and being able to make it to the end is an honor and blessing. That is why when I heard the military band play our National Anthem I got up from my chair and saluted the Flag. We hear it being played at every athletic event possible, and at other public functions, but it does not have the same impact as during a military event.

During the Olympics we hear every kind of national anthem imaginable. As each contestant mounts the podium in their respective places, only the winner of the contest hears his/her national anthem. As you watch each winner their expression is always of joy, and the feeling of knowing that they did the best he/she could that day. It is all about conquering individual goals and obstacles that motivates each participant.

On the other hand, for the military it is about the country and not personal goals even though the Army at one time used a commercial campaign that stated "An Army of One." The military does not see an individual, but sees all in it as one. That is why we

Veterans who served in the military are so closely knit. When one of our comrades falls we all fall, but we pick up where he/she left off. Each one of us remembers those who fell and when the sound of the trumpet playing our National Anthem is heard, it sends chills up our spines. As our Lord in St. John's Gospel put it, "Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends (15:13)." Those who have seen and felt their brother fall in battle will never forget it, and when they hear the symbol and hymn that they died for it moves us all.

Furthermore, during the Vietnam War many came to bring a little joy to those over there by way of the USO. Some of them did it to gain recognition and to boost their own careers. Others, however, did it to support fellow countrymen and to lighten the load of our warriors. One such person was Martha Raye. In 1967, she helped the wounded and dead off the Chinook helicopter when it landed in Pleiku. Then she went to the USAF Medical Center to help with the wounded and to assist the nurses, But after all this, still managed to do a show for the "boys and gals." She wore an Army uniform with Colonel insignias and a Special Forces Green Beret. Her rank of Colonel was honorary, as was her membership into the Green Beret Special Forces unit. Not to be left out, the US Marines also gave her the rank of honorary Colonel. This exceptional woman upon her death on October 19, 1994 was granted a burial site among veterans of many wars at the Fort Bragg Cemetery in Fayetteville, NC, the home base of the Special Forces Green Berets.

Colonel Raye (Honorary) is not your typical everyday individual who goes about their life with eyes that are so very myopic they learn to ignore those who are struggling around them. However, she was married 7 times, and if she was Orthodox, the Church would have looked at her in a negative light, since we allow only 3 marriages by divorce. Her religious affiliation is revealed in one of her famous quotes, "One paper says I'm Catholic and the other says I'm Jewish. I guess that's fitting because as a Methodist I'm meant to be undetermined some of the time."

Finally, no one knows what is in each person's heart, but the best way to find out is to see from where they came from and then see who they are today. Each person has to find his/her own way, but it is through a life of sacrifice and struggles that we can understand

that God has and will always be with us no matter what. Many times we call upon God to fix or make something happen for us like, sickness, money, marriage, children, and other things we of the "Dust" must go through while here on earth. That is why our Lord says in Matthew 6:21 "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Let all of us thank God for all the things He has given us, and has let us go through for our betterment. This life is not by chance and He made it for us all, but do we thank Him for it? A beautiful prayer from the Orthodox Sacrament of Baptism is very telling about what He has done for us.

"For by Your Will have You out of nothingness brought all things into being and by Your power sustain all creation and by Your Providence direct the world. You, from the four elements, have formed creation and have crowned the cycle of the year with the four seasons; all the spiritual powers tremble before You; the sun praises You; the moon glorifies You; the stars in their courses meet with You; the light hearkens unto You; the depths shudder at Your presence; the springs of water serve You; You have stretched out the Heavens as a curtain; You have founded the earth upon the waters; You have bounded the sea with sand; You have poured forth the air for breathing; the angelic Powers minister unto You; the Choirs of Archangels worship before You; the many-eyed Cherubim and the six-winged Seraphim, as they stand and fly around You, veil themselves with fear of Your unapproachable Glory; for You, being boundless and beginningless and unutterable, did come down on earth, taking the form of a servant, being made in the likeness of men; for You O Master, through the tenderness of Your Mercy, could not endure the race of men tormented by the devil, but You did come and saved us. AMEN!

The minutes of the 10 November, 2012 Meeting were read. A motion to approve was made, seconded and the motion was approved by the membership.

New Business

Sharing of members e-mail, telephone and address information was addressed by Bill Ray and Gale Helser. Due to privacy issues, the membership roster will not be made available on the website or through e-mail. Individual information will be made available by officers when requested. Bill said we have approximately 375 members and members are responsible for all changes to their contact information.

With no further business or discussion, a motion to adjourn was made and seconded and approved by the membership

Mark your calendars for **September 27, 28 & 29, 2014**. The Blue Bulls will once again be gathering for our annual reunion event in the music capital of the world. It's not too early to make your reservations. As a matter of fact, the earlier, the better.

We have started with a block of 30 rooms at The Sheraton Music City, www.sheratonmusiccity.com, and those will go really fast. In order to add to our block, we need to have the first 30 reserved before they open up

an additional block. If you *know* you are going to attend, please make your reservations NOW. If you *think* you are going to attend, make your reservations NOW. Even in you only *think or want* to attend, make your reservations NOW. (See the pattern here?!?) We only have until August 28, 2014 to adjust our maximum room block. There is no risk by making a reservation early and there is no deposit required, so there is no cost until you arrive. In addition to no risk, you can also cancel up until 48 hours prior to the reunion without any charges. This is a very popular hotel and it fills up very rapidly, so book today. The hotel is also offering a "3-day prior and 3-day following" price protection for anyone who would like to arrive early or stay after the reunion to see more of the area. We have secured an extremely good rate of \$99 per night, which is very good for this area and the hotel is a first class property. The Contact person at the Sheraton is Julia Purdue at 615-231-1242 on-site at the hotel. Be sure to mention that you are with the 39th Eng Bn Reunion to be sure to get this rate. DO NOT use any of the 800 reservation numbers or go through a third party to make your reservations. Be sure to deal directly with Julia. Once again, timing is very important so we can add more rooms and be sure that everyone who wants to attend is able to.

Getting There. Most of the East and Midwest areas are within a reasonable driving distance and we will be sending driving directions to anyone who requests them. Flying is another good option as the airport in Nashville is very close to our Hotel. The hotel will also provide pick-up and drop-off service for flyers.

The Hotel. Sheraton Music City is a full-service, very highly rated property located near the Nashville Airport and many local attractions. Our accommodations are very spacious and our meeting areas are convenient and comfortable. The Hotel is smoke-free; however, there are many outside areas with easy access and a patio area just across the hall from our Hospitality room. The hotel is very large with many amenities; check it out for yourself on line.
